

Dear visitor of Junior Worlds in Oberstdorf,

To make your trip more comfortable, here is a description of how to get from Munich airport to Oberstdorf. Print out this information and take it with you.

### At Munich Airport

At Munich (The German word is München) Airport look for the green S-signs which will lead you to the airport railway station. Before entering the platform, there are ticket machines or counters to buy the ticket. Use the touch-screen vending machines in the following way:

- Press the flag area, then press the British flag
- Press "Laender Tickets"
- Press "Laender Tickets Bavarian and others"
- Press "Bavarian Ticket", if you travel with 1, 2 3 or 4 other people: One ticket for all: 27 Euro
- Or Press "Bavarian Ticket Single" if you travel alone: 19 Euros for you alone
- Press "Today"
- Press "Without D-Train"
- Press "No Bike Ticket"
- Pay by entering your credit card into the machine

This "Bavarian" ticket is valid in all trains I will mention for travel to Oberstdorf on the same day. If you stay a night in Munich, you need a ticket for about 7 Euros to Hauptbahnhof and then a Bayernticket from Munich to Oberstdorf for the day of your trip.

If this is too complicated or does not work, go to a counter, where the ticket is 2 Euros more expensive. But tell them you need a Bayernticket (single), otherwise you get a more expensive ticket.

The trains leave from the airport around every ten minutes. There are two lines (S1 and S8), both take about 45 minutes to the main railway station.

### At Munich Main Railway Station

At Hauptbahnhof (German word for main railway station) which is the 13<sup>th</sup> or 14<sup>th</sup> station after the airport, leave the train and move up several escalators (signs DB) until you are in the big train departure hall. Be aware of pickpockets there, don't leave your baggage unattended.

There are direct trains from München Hauptbahnhof to Oberstdorf every two hours during the day. Oberstdorf is the final destination of these trains, so you cannot get too far. These direct trains leave from München Hauptbahnhof at

6:52 a.m.,

9:21 a.m.,

11:21 a.m.,

1:21 p.m. (= 13:21),

3:21 p.m.(=15:21),

5:21p.m. (= 17:21), and

7:21 p.m. (=19:21) (this one with a change in Kempten at 20:52/21:00 and an additional change in Immenstadt 21:16/21:26).

There are some trains in between, but you would have to change once or twice, and for some you would need a more expensive ticket, so avoid them. From Munich to Oberstdorf it takes about 2.30 hours. Go to one of the yellow departure information posters and find out from which track your train leaves. It should be around track 30 or 35. Or check the actual departure on the large electronic board above you in the main area.

Attention, it takes some minutes to walk from the airport train exit to your track. If you have heavy baggage, take a trolley. You have to put in a coin of 1 Euro, but you get the money back at the end. You may move into the trains as soon as they are standing on the track, but be careful not to enter an earlier train which leaves from the same platform. It is not necessary to reserve a seat. If you arrive at least five or ten minutes before departure, you should always find a seat. At the beginning of each platform you find a sign which train is the next one to leave from this track. You can buy snacks and drinks in one waggon of the train. Please note: after about two hours in Immenstadt, the train changes its direction.

### [In Oberstdorf to your hotels](#)

In Oberstdorf, the three media hotels are within a mile from the railway station. The Mohren hotel is opposite the church at the market square, the two other hotels are a few blocks in southwestern direction from the church. Or take a taxi which costs 5-7 Euros at the most. The rink is on the east side of the town, near the Nebelhorn mountain and the Nebelhorn cable car which goes almost over the roof of the rink.

You will find the accreditation in the small entrance area of the rink, right after the main entrance door on your right side. If you come to Warsaw in January, I will show you a map.

### [Back from Oberstdorf](#)

You can buy again a Bayernticket (single) for 19 or 27 Euros at a ticket machine to get from Oberstdorf to Munich airport. The following trains leave from Oberstdorf to Munich Main Station:

5:10 only MON to FRI, change in Kempten 5:59/6:04, arrival at Main station 6:44, arrival at the airport around 7.45.

5:58 only MON to FRI, change in Immenstadt 6:26/6:29, another change in Kempten at 6:46/6:51 arrival in Munich at 8:18

7:04 every day, change in Immenstadt 7:36/7:41, another change in Buchloe 8:42/8:47, arrival 9:37

8:06 every day, direct to Munich, arrival 10:37

10:06 every day, direct to Munich, arrival 12:37

12:08 every day, direct to Munich, arrival 14:37

14:08 every day, direct

16:06 every day, direct

18:10 every day (this is the last direct train without change)

### [Back in Munich](#)

Look for the green S-sign in the big hall and go down several escalators. There are many trains from the same platform, take only lines 1 or 8 to Flughafen Terminal (Airport) which is the final destination (the next after Flughafen Besucherpark), not in the other direction. Please note for S1 trains (departure x:05, x:25 and x:45 every hour, in western direction): Only the back part of the train goes to the airport, so do not get onto the first half. S8 trains (departure x:18, x:38 and x:58 every hour in eastern direction) go completely to the airport. Ask other passengers if you are not sure.
